Careers events this week

The Year 13 Sarum Academy students were very helpful and engaging with our students and it felt very welcoming. The girls were not deterred if they couldn't complete the hair style task – they persevered and by the end were putting Christmas glittery strands in each other hair!



We were fortunate to have representatives from Sarum Academy and Salisbury sixth form to attend our Year 11 subject consultation evening to answer questions and give advice to Year 11 students and parents. We also welcomed ASK apprenticeships who were able to advise about career pathways through apprenticeship routes. On Thursday 5th December 30 Year 11 students participated in an ASK workshop, registering on the website and exploring apprenticeship jobs and opportunities.

General Election

WYVERN ST EDMUND'S STUDENT COUNCIL



Our aim is for every student to have their voice heard and to be able to contribute to decisions about their school.

How it works:

Each tutor group has two elected student voice representatives who sit on the student council.

Each term there are two student voice focus weeks. In these weeks a tutor time is dedicated to debate and feedback.

Each term each year group council will meet with their head of year to raise any issues and suggest ideas. These will then be discussed by the senior leaders of the school and feedback will be given to the reps to share with their tutor group.

Each term the council will represent their tutor group in discussions on topics about whole school improvement or changes with senior leaders.
